About our room...

We know it can be an exciting yet daunting experience leaving your child in a new environment. We encourage families to come in for as many 'play' visits as possible with your child before your enrolment start day to familiarise your child with their new environments, educators and children around them. All children will settle differently, and this builds trust between children, families and educators.

As children grow, their abilities and skills change and develop. In the toddler's room we encourage all children to begin developing their independence and self-help skills. Their communication and developmental skills are becoming more complex, our educators create interesting and exciting experiences for our toddlers that develop core skills that they will grow and continue to develop as they get older. Our room is divided into two rooms, which flow into each other and into our outdoor environment. This allows our educators to create their environments to support children's learning and development. This also allows indoor / outdoor play giving children a choice in their play throughout the day.

During mealtimes we sit on chairs at the table, we are learning to drink out of cups, we sleep on mattresses on the floor supervised by educators, we spend as much time outside playing in and observing our natural environment as possible.

We allow children to explore and investigate through a range of different sensory activities and experiences which might result in your child getting dirty. Please know while this may get on our clothes, we are developing our curious minds and learning so many important skills!

Routines

We cater for all children's differing needs and follow any routines that you may have or use in your home environment such as toilet training. We have a room routine specific to the age of the children within our room, please speak to our room leader if you wish to see our routine or would like to give input.

Communication

Communication between families and educators is essential in providing high quality care and education for your child. Our room has a communication board that outlines sleep times, meals eaten and a see staff section. Through our Storypark, we are able to communicate the educational program and observations on your child daily, it also allows for direct ocnversations to be had with educators privately. We also encourage verbal communication with our educators to ensure all questions or concerns are delt with in a professional manner.

Sun Policy

We endeavour to allow children to play outside every day. Sunscreen will be applied 20 minutes before going outside. It is extremely important that you pack a hat every day in your child's bag. We recommend that all children have t-shirts with sleeves. If your child has sensitive skin, you may wish to provide your own sunscreen. Upon arrival to the service please ensure you apply sunscreen on your child before entering the room with the sunscreen provided so they can play outside as quickly as possible.

Medication

If your child requires medication during the day, please see an educator, fill in a medication form physically hand the medication to an educator. Please remember that if your child is on medication, as per our 'Administration of Authorised Medication' policy your child will need to stay at home for at least 24hrs from starting medication. This gives the medication time to sink in, even if your child has been on this kind of medication before each batch made is different. Please familiarise yourself with our centres illness policy as we do have exclusion periods for certain illnesses.

What to bring

- Water bottle (please bring empty)
- Hat
- Bedding
- A few spare changes of clothes
- Nappies (at least 5)
- Formula (if your child still drinks, please note we must have a physical un-opened formula tin, alternatively you can provide un-opened formula sachets)

Educational Program

Our Curriculum is based on the Early Years Learning Framework and involves careful planning and critical reflection which increases the value of children's time in our care. We ensure our educational program and practice responds to children's interests and scaffolds their learning. You as a family are children's first teacher and know your child best, it is important that you share information with us which we could use and include into our program and your child's individual learning. We believe having parents involved in our service enriches the educational program for our children. If you have any special talents or skills that you would like to come in and share with the children and educators please let us know!

Throughout the year, your child will explore and investigate through a range of activities and experiences whilst with us in the babies' room. We create a portfolio keepsake for you to take home at the end of the year where all these memories and experiences are kept.

Storypark

During your child's time with us, we use a range of different methods of documenting your child's learning journey. This includes Storypark, an online observation website and app for educators and families to interact with and document children's learning and experiences. Here you can watch your child's learning journey at our service, keep up-to-date with notifications, events, important information from the office and even share your own journey with your child with us!



The Storypark 'Families' app can be found in the app store of your mobile.
